rother Nicodemus, or Brother Nick as most people called him, was a wonderful friend of the First Spiritualist Church of Salem. He was a member of the Tuesday night class for more than 25 years.

His great love was education. He was first a teacher, and later, the Library Director at St. John's Prep in Danvers. He dedicated his career not just to educating, but inspiring, the younger generation. Some years after he left St. John's, the Northshore Sunday newspaper ran a feature story on Brother Nick. When the article appeared, he received many phone calls and letters from his former students. Some had gone on to serve in the Peace Corp and many others worked in the helping professions. All of them were so anxious to let Brother Nick know how he had changed their lives.

Brother Nick was always a spiritual seeker. In the 1970s, he decided to enroll in a spirituality class at Middlesex Community College in Bedford. At this class, he would begin a lifelong friendship with the teacher of that class and pastor of the First Spiritualist Church of Salem, the Reverend Gladys Worsencroft.

Brother Nick is often remembered in the spiritual unfoldment classes at the First Spiritualist Church of Salem. For those that knew him while he was on the earth plane, they recount warm and tender memories of Brother Nick. 



The First Spiritualist Church of Salem offers dedicated days for healing. One Saturday per month, the church's healers gather to serve, free of charge, the congregation and greater community by offering healing to those in need of physical, emotional, or spiritual healing.

Each healing day begins with an opening prayer, the recitation of the Prayer for Spiritual Healing, and a guided meditation. Soft, uplifting instrumental music plays in the background. Attendees come and go to meditate, sit in quiet prayer, receive a hands-on healing, place a name in the healing book, and/or visit with one another downstairs in Olmstead Hall where there is always a pot of coffee made and sweet treats.

Every Sunday between the early and healing services, the Guild serves lunch in Olmstead Hall. In the past, someone would sign up to purchase, prepare and serve the meal. This same individual would be responsible for cleaning up afterwards, too.

This year, the Guild is trying a new way. Instead of preparing the meal at home and carting it to church, there are pre-made meals frozen in the freezer. There are also other options, such as spaghetti, soup, and so forth stored in the kitchen cabinets.

The sign up sheet now has two columns: one for the person or persons who volunteer to prepare the lunch on the premises, and one for the person or persons who volunteer to clean up.


